AAI's Census outreach efforts are part of a national effort to ensure a complete, fair and accurate count of all Asian Americans in the U.S.

Prior to joining AAI, Rich worked for the Council for a Parliament of the World's Religions (CPWR) where he was the lead designer for international communications and interactive media. Prior to CPWR, Mr. Pak was a Policy Research Analyst at the Utah Foundation, where he researched and analyzed multiple public policy topics as well as collaborating with the media in public policy awareness campaigns. Prior to Utah Foundation, Mr. Pak was a Business Analyst for M-Biotech, a medical device company where he helped raise investment by developing relationships with key investors and business partners.

Mr. Pak will receive a Master Divinity from McCormick Theological Seminary in May 2010, and received his Bachelor of Science degree in Industrial Engineering from the University of Michigan and Bachelor of Science in Political Science from the University of Utah.
